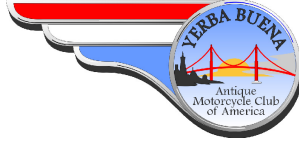


**Yerba Buena Chapter

Feb 4th, 2015 Minutes

Meeting called to order: 7:10 pm

New Members/Guests:

- Lorin Guy told us about the upcoming Quail Motorcycle Gathering on May 16th. If we want, the club can get a booth that includes display space for 3 motorcycles for \$250. Includes vehicle/trailer parking, entry for 3, and lunch for 3. Individuals can enter bikes for showing. There's free parking for spectators who ride a motorcycle to the event. Spectator cost is \$65.
- Rob O'Neill told us about the classic vehicle (motorcycles and cars) insurance options he provides. There are three types of loss coverage that insurance companies offer
 1. The regular coverage we normally have on our everyday vehicles. If your vehicle is a total loss (stolen or totaled), the insurance company pays the depreciated value of your vehicle.
 2. Stated value coverage. You determine the value of your vehicle, but if you have a total loss the insurance company will pay you an amount based on what a replacement vehicle would cost. You may have to fight for a higher settlement (they may locate a "similar" vehicle available for the amount they are offering, but factors that affect value may not be accounted for resulting in a lower settlement offer).
 3. Agreed or Guaranteed Value coverage. This is the type Rob recommends. You establish a value that the company agrees to. The insurance company pays you the coverage amount in the case of a total loss.

In some cases, the insurance company will pay you shop rate to do your own damage repairs, rather than having to take your vehicle to a shop.

With Rob's insurance, your liability coverage premium applies to all the vehicles you insure with him (you pay a single liability premium for all vehicles). You pay an additional comprehensive (loss) premium for each individual vehicle covered by the policy. The comprehensive premiums are pretty low, and he offers discounts for multiple vehicles, alarm systems, etc. Vehicles must be stored in a garage or other enclosed facility.

Rob also provides insurance coverage for events.
